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Activities, Achievements and Performance during 2020

Activities contributing to the Group's funds have included: -

- Sales of donated books and magazines, railway timetables and memorabilia, cameras, volunteers' badges and buttons, bringing in a total of £301.35.
- Sale of new books and DVDs, Moorsline binders and sales proceeds from our stand at the York Model Railway Exhibition, bringing in a total of £808.30.
- We benefited from an initial part payment of £35,000 from a bequest from the late Margaret Newman, sister of our late member, Bob Hunter.

Activities were severely restricted by Coronavirus restrictions but some volunteers worked on dismantling redundant Esk Valley track donated by Network Rail, for onward sale as scrap materials to generate income for the NYMR, and crewing trains when these were allowed to run.

We have pledged funding of £9,000, which enabled the purchase of a second-hand, excellent condition Kubota 2.8T KX71-3 mini digger for the Levisham Station Group.

Where appropriate, some funds are spent on the provision of protective workwear for volunteers engaged in permanent way and engineer's fleet repair activities.
